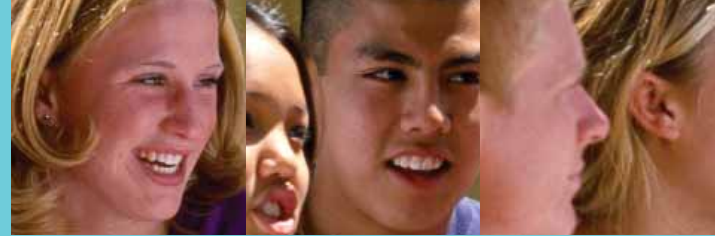


Why Humane Education?

★ **Violence Prevention** Animal abuse is one of the top three indicators for troubled youth. The majority of the school shooters “practiced” their violence on animals first. Humane education teaches the appropriate care and treatment of animals, helping students develop their compassion and empathy, which better enables them to be respectful in their dealings with other people.

★ **Character Education** Humane education develops the values of kindness, respect, compassion, responsibility, and fairness in students, making it an integral part of any character education program.

★ **Empathy Building** Child psychologists believe that it is vital for students to learn empathy—the ability to put themselves in someone else’s position. Empathy improves a student’s ability to act responsibly, cooperate, solve problems, and communicate with others. Humane



education awakens empathy by helping students appreciate and connect with others.

★ **Youth Empowerment** Humane education allows students to examine the relationship between their values and behavior and the consequences of their actions. Once students understand the ramifications of their actions, they realize that their choices make a difference. Humane education teaches students how to create a better, more compassionate world through their consumer choices and by becoming an informed and socially responsible citizen.

★ **Development of Critical-Thinking Skills** Discussing humane issues inspires students to think critically about the values and actions of our society and the information on which those values and actions are based.

What Is **Humane Education**?

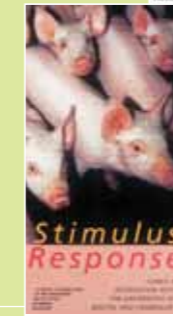

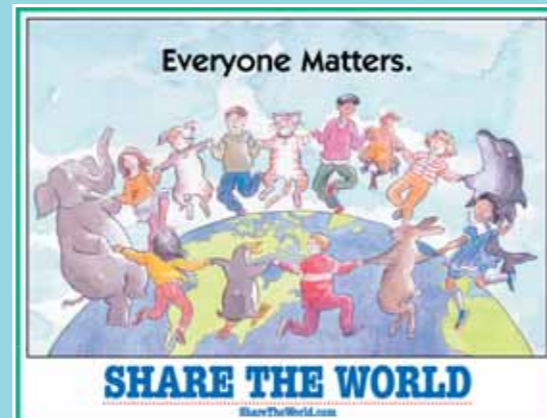

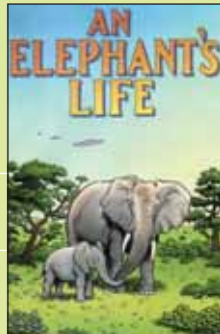

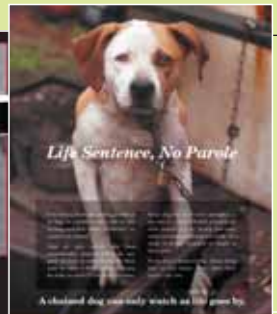
